# The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn by Mark Twain

#### Chapter 1

- 1. What point of view is this story told from? First person. Huck Finn
- 2. Who is Huck Finn? A wayward boy, who is being raised by a kindly woman; he has a large fortune from an incident that happened in *Tom Sawyer*
- 3. Who was the Widow Douglas? Huck's unofficial guardian
- 4. What things annoyed Huck about the Widow Douglas? She made him wear new clothes, rung a bell for supper, insisted that Huck come on time. She prayed before Huck could eat, she cooked things separately, read the Bible and stories about dead people (who are useless), had a rule about no smoking.
- 5. Who was Miss Watson? The Widow Douglas's sister
- 6. How did Huck offend Miss Watson? He said he wanted to go to Hell
- 7. What superstition did Huck have regarding the spider? He killed one accidentally and knew that it would bring him back luck.
- 8. How did Huck combat the evil coming his way from the spider's untimely death? He took off his clothes, turned around 3 times, crossed his breast every time and tied up a lock of hair to keep the witches away.
- 9. Who came to Huck's window and convinced him to sneak out? Tom Sawyer
- 10. Why did Huck leave? He wanted adventure, fewer rules and less structure.

- 1. Why was Huck so itchy? He and Tom were cornered by Jim. Jim wasn't leaving until whoever was out there came clean. Huck got an itch and could only think about that.
- 2. How did the boys manage to get away? Jim fell asleep.
- 3. What trick did Tom play on Jim? He took his hat off and hung it on the tree. What did Jim say happen? The witches bewitched him and put him in a trance and rode him all over the state, then set him under the tree and hung his hat on the limb.
- 4. How did Jim explain the \$0.05 piece Tom left for the candles? It was a charm the devil gave to him that he could use to cure people or fetch the witches
- 5. Why were the boys meeting? To form a band of robbers
- 6. What were some of the things the oath of the gang involved? Never tell any secrets, cut the throat as punishment for telling secrets, then burn the carcass, put a curse on that person. Don't do anything to anyone in the band (if they did, the boy was ordered to kill that person and his family)
- 7. What did Huck have to do to get in? Offer up Miss Watson as someone to kill in the event he broke the oath since he didn't have any family
- 8. What was the line of business of the gang? Stop stages and carriages, kill or ransom the people and take their money and watches
- 9. What plan did they have for the women they captured? Take them to the cave, be polite as pie and then they will fall in love with their captors and never want to go home

- 1. What was Huck's theory regarding prayer according to Miss Watson? If he prayed every day, he would get whatever he asked for. What did Miss Watson really mean? He would receive "spiritual gifts." It would help him to think more of others and less of himself.
- 2. Describe the 2 Providences (idea of God's treatment of humans) interpreted by Huck. Widow Douglas: It would make a body's mouth water. Miss Watson: It would take hold of a person and knock him down again. Which did Huck hope for? The widow's He saw no chance if Miss Watson's got there first.
- 3. What did they think happened to Huck's father? Drowned. Why weren't they sure? His face was distorted.
- 4. Give an example of Tom's imagination. A group of Arabs and Spanish had set up camp with 400 soldiers guarding them. They had elephants and treasure. What did it turn out to be? A Sunday school class with donuts and jam. OR The Genie in a tin-lamp who grants wishes.

- 2. What "bad luck" did Huck have? He noticed some footprints and there was a cross in the left boot heel made with big nails to keep off the devil

- 4. Whose tracks did Huck see? His father's
- 5. How did Jim try to help? By reading Huck's fortune from a hairball. Did it work? Only after Huck paid it with a counterfeit quarter

- 1. Why was Huck afraid of his Father? He was abusive.
- 2. What did Huck's father want? Huck's money

- 1. What fortune appeared on the river? An empty canoe. What did Huck plan to use it for? Hide it then use it to escape
- 2. How was Huck able to escape? He sawed a hole in the cabin, then made it look like a robbery. He shot a pig and used its blood to look like a murder
- 3. Where did he go? To Jackson's Island
- 4. What does this scheme reveal about Huck? He is resourceful, crafty, quick thinking, and dishonest.

- 3. What was Jim's plan for his freedom? Save up enough money to buy his wife. Then buy his two children or get someone to steal them
- 4. What was Huck's plan to ease his conscience? Row to shore and turn Jim in
- 5. What made him change his mind? Jim told him Huck was the only white man who had kept his promise.

- 6. How did Huck's quick thinking save Jim from the slave catchers? He lied and said his father was sick. They way he acted led the men to believe he had small pox.
- 7. What was the result of Huck's lie? The men gave him \$40 and Jim escaped yet again
- 8. What bad luck did they attribute to the snake skin? Not finding Cairo, losing their canoe, steamboat smashing their raft
