First Steps with Phonics

Materials Needed:

- · small sticky notes
- · cardstock

Optional (but recommended!):

Montessori Green Language Series cards from The Little Spark Company

Prerequisites:

Before starting on this program, your child should know:

- · the names of all the letters of the alphabet
- · the sounds of the consonants

Tips:

- · Print all pages with word cards, pictures cards, and segmenting boards on card stock and for durability and review. Save them for future lessons.
- · Consider keeping a binder to keep sentence pages, sorting pages, and handwriting/spelling pages in. This will serve as a good tool for review.
- · Store phonogram tiles and word and picture cards in separate envelopes or boxes.
- · Establish a daily review drill. Each day practice reading (sounding out), segmenting (breaking up a word into its sounds), and building (spelling) previously learned phonograms and words.

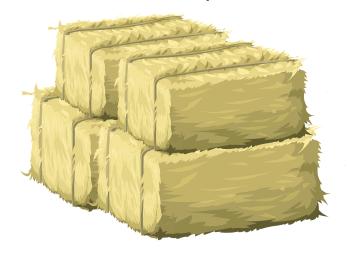

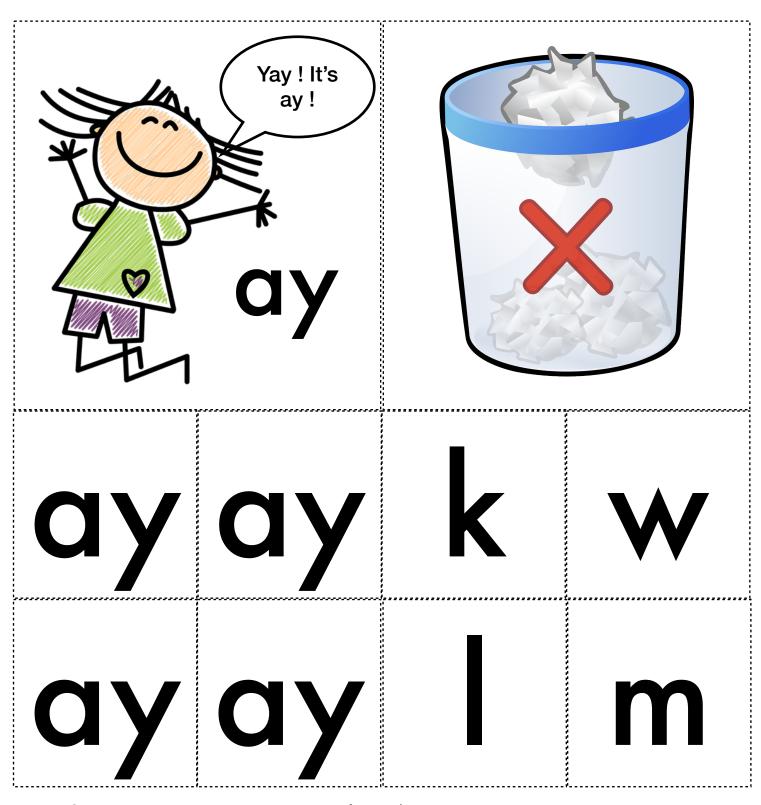

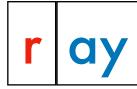
Activity 1 - Word tiles and picture cards

- 1. Lay out the following pictures from the previous activity: *hay, ray,* and *bay.* Help your child name them. Say the words slowly.
- 2. **Demonstrate.** Using the tiles, spell "ray". Slowly demonstrate how to sound out the word, pointing to each phonogram as you say it. Then ask your child to choose the correct picture. Repeat with all the AY picture cards.









3. **Collaborate.** Repeat the activity again, this time inviting your child to sound out only the *last* phonogram (AY) after you sound out the first letter.

For example: You say "rrrrrr"

Your child says "aaaay".

Together you say, "rrrrraaaaaaaay..... ray. Ray!"

Repeat this process with all the words.

Repeat the activity again with each of the words, inviting your child to sound out only the first letter, while you add "ay".

4. **Fade your aid.** Eventually, encourage your child to sound out both phonograms, always pointing to them, and then choose the correct picture.

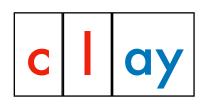
Activity 2 (Optional) - Montessori picture and word cards

- 1. Take out all the AY picture and word cards: jay, pay, hay, clay, tray, and crayon.
- 2. Lay out the picture cards for *jay*, *pay*, and *hay*. Help your child name them and then say the words slowly, listening to the AY sound.
- 3. Show your child the *hay* word card. Help your child to sound out the word and place it beneath the correct picture. Repeat with *jay* and *pay*.



- 4. Lay out the picture card for *tray, clay,* and *crayon*. Help your child name them and then say the words slowly, listening to the AY sound. These are much harder words to sound out. So...
- 5. Show your child the word *clay*. Spell it with the tiles. Tell your child these are much harder to sound out because they have three sounds instead of two. Count the tiles.





- 6. Slowly demonstrate how to sound out the word, pointing to each phonogram as you say it. Do not, at this point, require your child to sound these out.
- 7. Help your child match the word to its picture. Repeat with clay and crayon.
- 8. Invite your child to sound out clay, tray, and crayon, but this time, you sound out the *first two* letters, and your child sounds out AY.

For example: You say "c - I - "

Your child says "aaaaay"

Together you say "c-l-aaaaay. Clay. Clay!"

9. Repeat with clay and crayon.

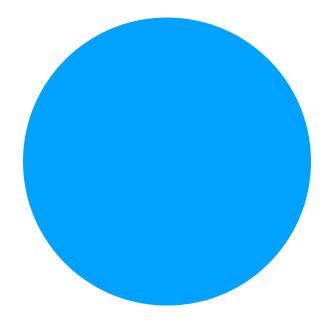
Activity 1 - Segment AY words

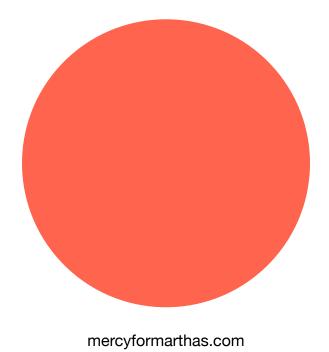
- 1. Take out: AY picture cards, and the segmenting card on the next page.
- 2. Take out the picture of the manta ray. Ask, "What's this?" After your child names it, say, "I'm going to say the word very slowly. Listen to the sounds."
- 3. Say "rrrrr-aaaaay". As you say "rrrrr", put your fist on the red dot. As you say "aaaay", your fist to the blue dot. Repeat this several times.
- 4. Invite your child to imitate. Together say the word "rrrrrraaaaaay". As your child says "rrrrrrr", put your fist on the red dot. As he/she says "aaaay" move, your fist to the blue dot.





- 5. Repeat this several times, moving your fist then your child's fist over the appropriate dots as you slowly say the sounds in the word.
- 6. Repeat with the following pictures and words: hay, say, jay, bay, and pay



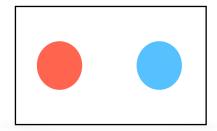

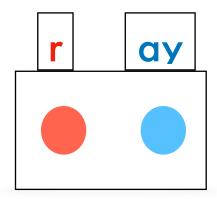
Activity 2 - Build AY words

- 1. Take out: phonogram tiles, AY picture cards, and segmenting card no. 1.
- 2. Take out the picture of the manta ray. Ask, "What's this?" After your child names it, say, "Let's say the word very slowly. Listen to the sounds.
- 3. Practice segmenting the word "ray" while helping your child move his/her fist on the segmenting card.





4. Lay out the R tile and the AY tile. Ask your child which tile should go above the red dot, and which should go above the blue dot.



- 6. Remove the segmenting card and push the tiles together. Say, "You just spelled ray! Yay!"
- 7. Repeat all the above steps with say, hay, bay, jay, and pay. Always give your child 3-4 phonograms to choose from, but no more.
- 8. For additional practice, help your child segment and spell the following: may, lay, way, day

The Three Meanings of Ray

"Ray" has three meanings:



Manta - Ray is a sea creature that has fins that look like wings.



Sun ray is a beam of light coming from the sun.



X - ray is a picture of the inside of your body.

Let's read words with AI!

Activity 1 - Word tiles and picture cards

- 1. Lay out the following pictures from the previous activity: *aim, rain,* and *wait*. Help your child name them. Say the words slowly.
- 2. **Demonstrate.** Using the tiles, spell "rain". Remind your child that AI makes the sound of /ay/ in the **middle** of a word, never at the end. Slowly demonstrate how to sound out the word, pointing to each phonogram as you say it. Then ask your child to choose the correct picture. Repeat with all the AI picture cards. Point out that in "aim", AI is at the beginning of the word.









3. **Collaborate.** Repeat the activity again, this time inviting your child to sound out only the **Al** phonogram after you sound out the first letter. Then you sound out the last letter.

For example: You say, "rrrrrr"

Your child says "aaaay".

You say, "nnnnn"

Together you say, "rrrrr...aaaaaaay....nnnnnn. rain. Rain!"

Repeat this process with all the words.

4. **Fade your aid.** Eventually, encourage your child to sound out the entire word, always pointing to the phonograms and then to the correct picture.

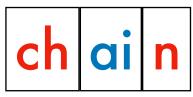
Activity 2 (Optional) - Montessori picture and word cards

- 1. Take out all the Al picture and word cards: mail, nail, snail, train, chain, and paint.
- 2. Lay out the picture cards for *mail*, *nail*, and *snail*. Help your child name them and then say the words slowly, listening to the /AY/ sound.
- 3. Show your child the *mail* word card. Help your child to sound out the word and place it beneath the correct picture. Repeat with *nail* and *snail*. Point out that these words rhyme.



- 4. Lay out the picture cards for *chain, train,* and *paint*. Help your child name them and then say the words slowly, listening to the /AY/ sound. These are much harder words to sound out. So...
- 5. Show your child the word *chain*. Spell it with the tiles. Tell your child that -ch makes /ch/.





- 6. Slowly demonstrate how to sound out the word, pointing to each phonogram as you say it. Do not, at this point, require your child to sound out -ch.
- 7. Help your child match the word to its picture. Repeat with train and paint.
- 8. Invite your child to sound out *chain, train,* and *paint*, but this time, you sound out all the phonograms but Al. Have your child always sound out Al.

For example: You say, "ch - "

Your child says, "aaaaay"

You say, "nnnnn"

Together you say "chaaaaaynnnnn. chain. Chain!"

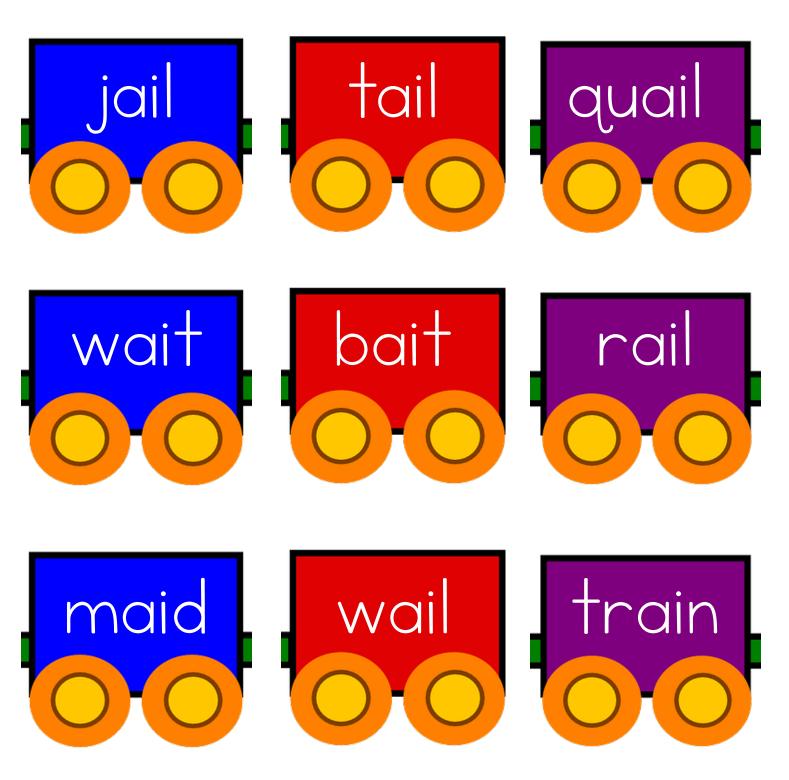

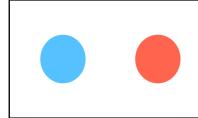
Activity 1 - Segment AI words

Take out: Al picture cards, segmenting cards 1 and 2.

Segmenting words with two sounds:

- 1. Take out the picture of "aim". Ask, "What's this?" After your child names it, say, "Let's say the word very slowly. Listen to the sounds.
- 2. Together, say "aaaaaaymmmmmm". Turn the segmenting card no. 1 upside down so the blue dot is first. As your child says "aaaaay", put your fist on the blue dot. As he/she says "mmmmm" move, your fist to the red dot.

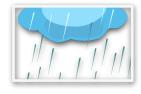


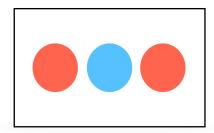


3. Repeat this several times, moving your fist then your child's fist over the appropriate dots as you say the sounds in the word.

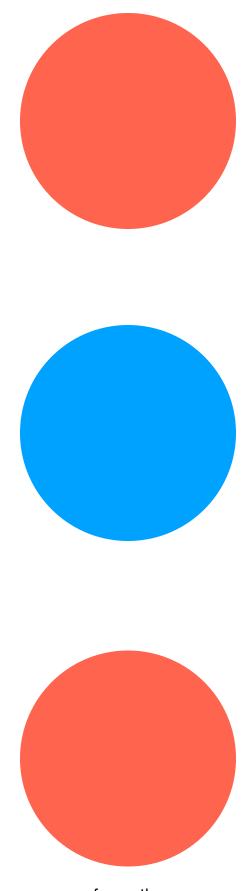
Segmenting words with three sounds:

- 1. Take out the picture of "rain." Ask, "What's this?" After your child names it, say, "Let's say the word very slowly. Listen to the sounds.
- 2. Together, say "rrrrrraaaaaaaymmmmmm". Put segmenting card no. 2 on the table.
- 3. As your child says "rrrrrrr", put your fist on the first dot.
- 4. As your child says "aaaaay", put your fist on the second dot.
- 5. As he/she says "nnnn" move, your fist to the third dot.





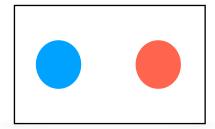
6. Repeat with the remaining Al pictures.



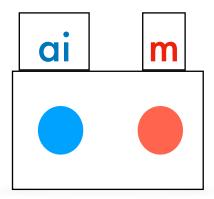
Activity 2 - Build Al words

- 1. Take out: phonogram tiles, Al picture cards, and the segmenting cards.
- 2. Take out the picture of "aim". Ask, "What's this?" After your child names it, say, "Let's say the word very slowly. Listen to the sounds.
- 3. Practice segmenting the word "aim" while helping your child move his/her fist on the segmenting card.





4. Lay out the M tile and the Al tile. Ask your child which tile should go above the red dot, and which should go above the blue dot.



- 6. Remove the segmenting card and push the tiles together. Say, "You just spelled aim!"
- 7. Repeat all the above steps with the rest of the Al words. Use segmenting card no. 2. Always give your child 3-4 phonograms to choose from, but no more.
- 8. For additional practice, help your child segment and spell the following: main, quail, pain
